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Introducing Machineable Presort

As of January 17, 2011, Canada Post will be offering a new presort option called Machineable Presort (MP) for Addressed Admail Short/Long pieces up to 50g. By now, you should have received information directly from Canada Post on this option. The specifications have recently been released and our technical team is preparing for certification on this option. We will include instructions including screenshots on how to prepare your mail using MP closer to the release of the product in January.

The pieces must meet all Machineable Mail specifications for size, aspect ratio, white space, formatting, etc., but will be presorted to the same levels as LCP Addressed Admail. The difference between MP and LCP is that the FCP and Residue containers will no longer require bundling but will be included, unbundled, in the containers like Machineable Mail. Depending on the density of your mailing, you could potentially have much less bundling to perform.

Pricing for MP is significantly less than LCP mailings as shown below. However, unless your mailing is very geographically dense (high numbers of DMD and DF pieces), it likely will not be less than regular Machineable Mail pricing. Since the specifications for MP and Machineable are the same, in most cases there will be no advantage to preparing MP mail and it will likely cost more. The bottom line is, if your pieces qualify as Machineable Mail, it may not be economically beneficial to send the mail Machineable Presort as the additional labour required to bundle will negate the marginal savings offered by this new presort option.

Geocoding Module Now Available

Geocoding will now appear on the main menu screen as a separate menu item. Once the "Run Geocoding" is selected, you will proceed to the next form.



The Geocoding Form allows you to select either the signed or unsigned format for longitude and latitude, as in the example below. A checkbox allows you to enable the option to create a list of postal codes that will be compared to your addresses. This will provide a list of the distance to the nearest postal code as well as which postal code was selected. Postal codes must be added one at a time but can be multi-selected to be removed.





The Geocoding Filter tab will be included on the Filter Mailing screen. On this tab, you can remove records from your database based on three options.

- 1. Remove the records that did not Geocode.
- 2. Remove records based on the distances that were generated from your distance list.
- 3. Remove a number of records starting from those closest or farthest away from the postal codes in your distance list.
